

Motion 1:

However, First Amendment Rights are not a blank check for any and all material for any and all age groups.

Motion 2:

When selecting books and other media for a school or classroom, the library professional and the teacher respectively shall choose materials that do not distract or overwhelm students with content above their maturity level that could harm their mental and emotional well-being. Attempts to manage content in an effort to protect students is not an attack on certain groups and should never be construed as such. The School and District supports responsible reading material that protects students mental and emotional health and honors the trust the parents have given the library professional and teacher.

If school library material is deemed too explicit to be read aloud by an adult during a public meeting, in the presence of children, or read aloud by a minor in front of an audience of their peers, then it automatically qualifies as going against the prevailing community standards and shall be automatically removed from the school and from its digital library.

If a student or teacher would be disciplined for using the same explicit or offensive language found in a select piece of school library material or media or if they could be charged outside of the school with a crime against children for showing or distributing the images or descriptions found within the library material, then the library material shall be automatically removed from the school and its digital library.

Motion 3:

A "Selection Criteria" rubric shall be filled out and signed by the school's library professional or classroom teacher for each piece of reading material or media selected for the school library, online library, or teachers' personal classroom libraries indicating the literary value of the material. The completed Selection Criteria rubric shall be made readily available to parents and shall be referenced by the Library Media Review Committee in the event a formal request is made for reconsideration of library material and checked for accuracy by the committee.
